"The Dad Factor"

The ICAN Principles of Fathering:

- o **Involvement**—kids spell love T-I-M-E. Spend as much time as your schedule will allow with your children.
- Consistency—your predictability, steadiness, and commitment as a dad builds a reference point for growth in your children.
- Awareness—you must tune in to the lives of your children. What is going on in your child's life? What does he/she need most in the next year to develop healthily?
- Nurturance—affirm your children. Give words of encouragement. Communicate how proud you are of them. Tell them you love them as much as possible.

- An overwhelming majority of Americans agree that fathers play an important and irreplaceable role in the lives of children.
- 89% of Americans agree that it is important for children to live in a home with both their mother and father.
- o 92% agree that fathers make a unique contribution to their children's lives.
