"God's Purposes"

• 3 Steps for Discerning the Will of God (Clinton & Hawkins, 2009):

- Believe that God will Show You His Will—though God's ways are not our own (Is. 55:8), we can trust and believe that He has a plan for our lives (Jer. 29:11). Pray for God to reveal His will for you (Ps. 32:8).
- Be Patient—often, God's will becomes evident after a period of time. Find contentment
 in your waiting. Continue to abide in Him (John 15) as you wait for His plans for your life
 to unfold.
- Seek Counsel—by asking for others to pray for you and mentor you, the will of God for your life may become more evident. The Lord may use godly and mature Christians to speak His promises and blessings over you.

• The Waiting Game: When God Doesn't Operate on Our Time

- God often makes us wait to make us ready.
- Use these times as training grounds. They test our character and God uses these things to get us ready for His purpose for us.
- These waiting seasons may seem totally unrelated to the call or dream that God has
 placed on our hearts, but it is important that we find God in these places.
- Training Grounds may include:
 - Financial hardship
 - Disillusionment with church
 - Betrayal
 - Rejection
 - Being overlooked
- Instead of asking why these things are happening, evaluate what obedience may look like in this season of discouragement and waiting.
- Trials reveal weaknesses in our character. God often allows this so that He can extract from our lives the very things that the enemy would use against us later.

• Key Thoughts:

- It is easy to get lost and confused in the pain, pressure, and pace of modern day life.
- Two of the biggest ways that the enemy will work against us is through a sense of
 inferiority and insecurity. If he can get us living in reaction to these things instead of in
 response to God's love, our own choices will sabotage the best of what God has for us.
- Getting in the way of God's plan:
 - **Self-ambition** includes not wanting to wait for what God has, and running ahead to try to make something happen on our own.
 - Self-preservation involves feeling as though we don't have anything to offer.
 When an opportunity comes, the fear of failure and exposure is enough to derail
- God's plan and purpose for us is not all about natural gifting or ability. Rather, it has
 everything to do with who God is and what He will do through us.
- To get a vision that is bigger than we are always involves being used by God to further
 His purposes.
- So much of our call is often very connected to either the worst thing we've ever done or the worst thing that has ever happened to us.
