"Dads and Daughters"

### • 4 Steps for Loving Your Daughter (Meeker, 2013):

- Give Love— it is essential that you tell your daughter that you love her as frequently as possible.
- Believe in Her—talk with her about her life. Encourage her. Help to minimize her fears.
  Affirm how precious she is to you.
- Use Words of Encouragement—girls use words to connect. Speak truth and validation into her life. Tell her she's beautiful. Let her know that you think she's great and that you are proud of her. Acknowledge her success and comfort her when she fails.
- Spend Time Together—make an effort to set aside time with your daughter. This may be as simple as a few minutes before bedtime, spending the day fishing, or riding to the store to grab a Coke. Your daughter needs you around. Your time with her is precious and fleeting—use it wisely.

#### • Dad and God:

- A dad is a daughter's first exposure to male love. Even in the very early years of her life, a daughter begins to discern whether her dad loves her, will protect her, and will meet her needs.
- o If a daughter is hurt by her father in these early years, she will not know about the love of her Father God.
- A dad must model Christ to his daughter. This may not always mean telling his daughter about Jesus. Rather, by showing his daughter what humility, goodness, integrity, and respect is like, a dad may model who Jesus is to his daughter.
- Dads should reveal Christ to their daughters through their character before attempting to teach them the scriptures and rules.

- Dads, because they speak less than mothers do, can get through to teenage daughters in ways that a mother cannot.
- Daughters don't always need you to talk a lot when you're with them. You don't need to perform. Just sitting together fosters safety and peace.
- Dads, regardless of where you are with your daughter, it is never too late to build a closer relationship with her.
